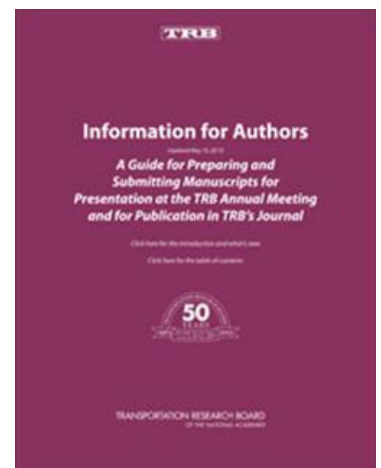

Information for Authors: A Guide for Preparing and Submitting Manuscripts for Presentation at the TRB Annual Meeting and for Publications in the TRB's Journal

TRB has released the latest version of its [information for authors guide](#). The guide is designed to help both new and veteran TRB paper authors navigate the paper submission process for TRB's upcoming Annual Meeting and for TRB's Transportation Research Record: Journal of the Transportation Research Board. All authors should review all information in this guide before submitting papers for consideration for presentation or publication.



The guide covers the organization and formatting of manuscripts for peer review and for publication, as well as instructions for submission. Papers that do not follow the guidelines may not be considered for presentation or publication.

Topics addressed by the guide include changes in the process from the publication of the last guide, critical dates to remember in the paper submission process, general guidelines, manuscript specifications, manuscript submission rules, TRB's peer review process, the submission of discussions for papers, and other general information.

On June 1, TRB will begin accepting papers for consideration as part of the program for [the TRB 93rd Annual Meeting](#), January 12-16, 2014, in Washington, D.C., and for publication in the Transportation Research Record: Journal of the

Transportation Research Board (TRR).

All papers must be submitted via [TRB's Paper Submission website](#) by August 1, 2013.

University representative of Delft University of Technology

I have a bachelor in Mechanical Engineering from College of Engineering, Guindy, Chennai (India) and a Masters degree in Engineering and Policy Analysis from the Delft University of Technology. I'm currently pursuing my PhD research in the field of transportation and logistics. I'm studying the exciting and challenging field of global freight transportation networks, which are complex, interrelated, and comprising dynamic and ever-increasing stakeholders.



Lack of awareness of the network interdependencies makes these networks vulnerable to dynamic events and disruptions, causing huge financial and operational losses and ripple effects along the network. My research focuses on exploring how shared situational awareness can be created to improve participative decision making in such complex intermodal transportation networks. My research utilizes serious games as both data collection and training tools to explore and enhance the decision-making and behavior of stakeholders in transportation networks to tackle dynamic events and disruptions.

Research Topic

The focus in my research is on disruption management in passenger railway transportation. A disruption is currently handled in a consecutive way. The first step is the modification of the timetable. Then, with the new timetable as input, the rolling stock circulation is rescheduled and finally with both the new timetable and the new rolling stock circulation as input the crew schedule is adapted. In my research the main focus is on rolling stock rescheduling and on integrating the three steps.

Education in Econometrics & Operations Research, specialization Quantitative Logistics and OR, thesis in OR & Health's Care. Interests are in Disruption Management, Quantitative modelling - e.g. robust and stochastic optimization, prediction models, statistical analysis/clustering techniques-, and public transport and public transport networks, especially railways.

Carlos Daganzo has published 143 Scopus-registered papers on transportation research since 1975. His research has a very wide scope, from public transport planning to traffic operations. More important, his papers show a consistent style: a simple innovative idea, with important consequences. Since they are difficult to read, you will not read all papers yourself. During the course, his ideas will be presented.

After this course, the student is able to:

- read a difficult paper and extract the underlying principle;
- work with several of the innovative and influential ideas put forward by Daganzo;
- stretch a simple idea, apply it and present the consequences;
- (hopefully) value simplicity in modelling.
